An Opportunity to Impact More Lives

Over the past few years, Ferncliff has become a regional and even nationally recognized service center. It is considered by many as one of the best places in Arkansas for individuals to experience personal growth. As a result, the number of guests coming to Ferncliff has increased. This is an exciting time for everyone who has invested time and energy in Ferncliff. From the camp to the Nature Preschool to the resources it provides, Ferncliff is reaching more people now than it has in its 85+ year history.

With the increase in participants, the grounds and facilities at Ferncliff have gone through wear and tear. Many of the buildings need major repair and renovation to keep up with the demand. In some instances the buildings can't accommodate the increase of individuals. We have to tell groups they cannot come to Ferncliff because we don't have rooms for them to stay in or space for them to meet.

Ferncliff is a respected and well-loved retreat for all people. With improved facilities, we can do more to be good stewards of creation and to impact lives.

When people come to Ferncliff they know they have entered a safe place to enjoy community, to learn, to heal, and to grow. Ferncliff is an invaluable resource to support people who are hurting, physically, emotionally, and spiritually.

It is not only the people who come to Ferncliff that we care about. We care for creation and how our guests interact with it. Ferncliff is an ecological and sustainable environment that allows people to discover the wonder of creation. Conservation awareness is a central part of Ferncliff and we try to instill this love for nature within each person.

Ferncliff reaches more people with a conference center, inviting guests to challenge, equip and restore themselves. It is a place where groups can get away from the noisy and interruption-filled environment to come together to connect with each other. The conference center is a place where one moment groups may work together to find solutions to difficult problems, and the next they may relax around the campfire.

Whether it is the summer camps, the conservation efforts, the Nature Preschool, the Disaster Assistance Center, or the conference center, **Ferncliff is a place that invests in future generations.**

Forever Ferncliff

Changing Lives for the Better

It is the intention at Ferncliff to enrich lives through creation and to encourage transformation in people and communities. The mission that guides Ferncliff is: **As an expression of God's love, we welcome people into a life of caring for Creation, others and themselves.**

Ferncliff is distinct from other camps in three ways. We are: **Green, Entrepreneurial, and Missional.**

Green

Focus on conservation and sustainability. To ensure we do everything in our power to respect and care for creation.

Entrepreneurial

Enable people to identify and make the most of every opportunity. To overcome and learn from setbacks and to succeed in a variety of settings.

Missional

To serve each person and encourage them to serve others during their time at Ferncliff and once they leave.



Changing Lives Through Sustainability

At the center of Ferncliff's mission is our approach to sustainability and creation care. We have made significant investments in energy efficiency improvements. We currently have more than 100 solar panels producing electricity and reducing our electricity bills. One of the best examples of our commitment to conservation efforts is the Eco Center. The Eco-Center at Ferncliff is one of the largest straw bale walled structures in the U.S. These walls make the building well insulated and keep energy costs low.

The Eco-Center originally served as home for Solar Under the Sun, a program that teaches people how to install solar power generating systems in the developing world. Once installed the solar power systems assist with the communities energy needs to provide off the grid electricity.

Each year students from all over the country come to Ferncliff to learn and support this program. Since 2019, Ferncliff has hosted well over 20 Solar Under the Sun schools and graduated over 350 students. Graduates have gone on to install solar energy systems that are powering water purification systems, wells, schools, churches, orphanages, health clinics, and homes. Through the Solar Under the Sun mission, students have brought electricity to countries around the world.

Now the Eco-Center is home to Ferncliff's Nature Preschool. It is only one of eight nature schools in Arkansas. Here children, ages 3-5, connect with the natural world and learn about it through play. Ferncliff teachers are Central Arkansas Master Naturalists. They received training at the Academy of Forest Kindergarten Teachers in California and through The Eastern Region Association of Forest and Nature Schools

As a result of concerted conservation efforts, Ferncliff received recognition as Little Rock's Greenest nonprofit and the Presbyterian's for Earth Care-Sustainability Award. In 2015, we received the Interfaith Power and Light National Award for Energy Efficiency.



Every aspect of Ferncliff challenges and develops each individual.

Ferncliff welcomes and serves everyone through its ministries. Involvement at Ferncliff is life-long and life-changing. During their time at Ferncliff, people are transformed. They grow in their ability and desire to care for creation, others and for themselves.

Summer Camp

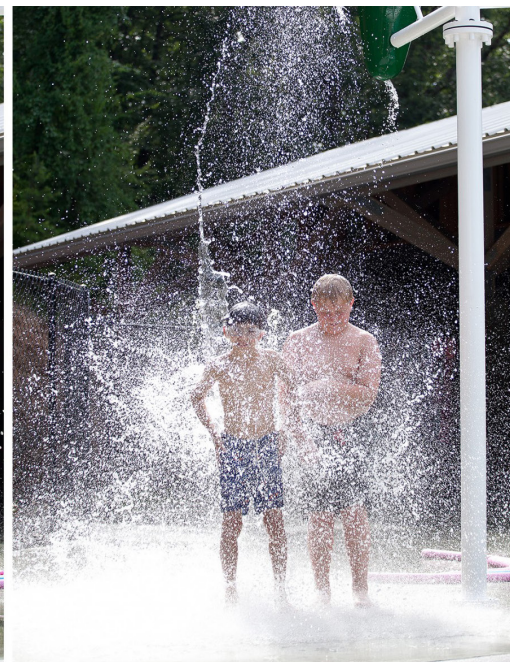
The heart and soul of Ferncliff is the summer camp program which runs from late May through early August. Each year we welcome over 1,600 kids and youth from pre-K through 12th grade. Ferncliff has day camps, overnight camps, and camps for the entire family.

Campers participate in activities such as: hiking, swimming, canoeing, kayaking, fishing, large group games, sand volleyball, mountain biking, mountain boarding, crafts, large group worship, small group Bible study, games, orienteering, camp fires, special events, and more.

Ferncliff welcomes and respects the rights of every person who steps foot on the Ferncliff grounds. It is a place for everyone to come together regardless of race, ethnicity, culture, gender, sexuality, ability, political affiliation, or religious beliefs. In turn, Ferncliff expects all individuals to offer the same rights and dignity to others, regardless of their differences. This is an inclusive and safe space for everyone.

It is the aim for every Ferncliff camper to expand their independence, to strengthen their sense of identity, to develop interpersonal skills, to interact with nature, and to explore their faith.

Nature Preschool

The mission of the Nature Preschool is to provide the highest quality child centered education, while strengthening the child's connection with the natural world through daily immersion and discovery in nature.

Nature Preschool began in 2014 and is the leading forest kindergarten program in Arkansas, if not our entire region. In the program, children ages 3-5 years develop a close relationship with the natural world. Each class spends the majority of their time outdoors and is PLAY based. Ferncliff was the first in Arkansas to offer this unique approach to learning.

The staff is trained in both early childhood education as well as nature based teaching practices. We are active Central Arkansas Master Naturalists and received our training at the Academy of Forest Kindergarten Teachers in California and through The Eastern Region Association of Forest and Nature Schools.

Nature Preschool started with 18 children and now serves almost 70 families.

We provide a developmentally appropriate early childhood curriculum with an emphasis on a child's connection with nature and PLAY. The program follows the forest kindergarten model and is "child led" with teachers acting as facilitators for learning.

Children and teachers spend 75% of their day immersed in the natural environment that surrounds our school in all weather. Daily activities include nature walks, interacting with farm animals and the onsite garden, observing the changes of the season, using natural materials to create works of art and most of all free play in the forest!

The majority of parents whose children attend the Nature Preschool say the transition from preschool to kindergarten goes very well. Children who graduate from our preschool develop excellent social emotional abilities, allowing them to establish and maintain positive relationships with others. Parents say the Nature Preschool gives their child skills to function in typical settings.

“During a time of uncertainty in the world, we stumbled upon Ferncliff’s Nature Preschool program, and it seemed like the perfect fit for our Nature-loving boy. **Ferncliff well exceeded any expectations we had.** It had a very low teacher-to-child ratio with the majority of time spent outdoors, regardless of the weather, allowing Waylon to learn in a safe play-based environment. Disaster Assistance Center

Ferncliff is unique in having its own 10,000 sq ft Disaster Assistance Center (DAC). Created in response to Hurricane Katrina, the center is a pivotal point in Ferncliff's step towards being a center of mission and ministry. Volunteers and campers pack a variety of different disaster kits such as hygiene kits, school kits, flood clean up buckets, feminine hygiene kits and refugee welcome backpacks. The kits help kids and adults during a stressful time. Kits get shipped out as fast as 24 hours after receiving a request.

Disaster relief is a compassionate response to individual and community tragedy that offers hope and help in the moment of need.



Since 2005, the center has received, inspected, and shipped over 1 million pounds of disaster kits to those in need. Ferncliff provides kits to churches and families all year long. In 2023, Ferncliff set up a sewing center in the DAC so volunteers can sew bags needed for the school kits. It is dedicated as the JoMo Sewing Center in honor of our dear friend and supporter, Joanne Mosley.

The DAC allows Ferncliff to create additional outreach ministries, including our "Sharing the Goods" program. This program serves over 130 local nonprofits and helps them preserve funds for their mission. This program saves our members over \$100k each year.

Each year, through the DAC volunteers respond to disasters all over the United States. The DAC has distributed kits to New Jersey, Texas, California, and Washington.

Jim and Joanne Mosley have supported Ferncliff for most of their lives. Jim oversaw the Presbytery's summer camp program at Ferncliff for over 25 years. Joanne has a heart for the Disaster Assistance Center. She has sewn more than 1,200 school kit bags to give to kids.

Ferncliff provides an inclusive setting for events involving youth or adults. The Center for Restoration and Healing welcomes nonprofit and faith-based organizations to conduct training, participate in team building, and for spiritual formation. It allows guests time away from the work environment to collaborate with one another. Guests can have time to unwind and enjoy the beautiful grounds at Ferncliff.

The center has a variety of meeting and lodging options including 36 hotel rooms, 12 cabins, a 25-bed retreat house and a 24-bed lodge, all designed to bring people together. Between June 2022 and June 2023, Ferncliff hosted 234 groups.

One of the hallmarks of Ferncliff is our hospitality. We treat each guest with respect and dignity. The staff at Ferncliff go above and beyond to care for guests. Ferncliff partners with many different organizations in a variety of ways. Recently, we worked with the Presbyterian Disaster Assistance Migration Accompaniment Ministries and provided temporary housing for Afghan refugee families.

“I am particularly impressed how a camp like Ferncliff can broaden its understanding of how to be a place for all different types of ministries that serve the church and the world. At the Center for Restoration and Healing, Ferncliff also offers a safe space to help people understand and manage the trauma they experienced due to a school shooting. For 6 years, we hosted kids who survived the Jonesboro Westside school shooting, giving them a safe place to talk, cry, and have someone there to listen and comfort them.

This year, they will come back to Ferncliff for a reunion, giving them another opportunity to connect with one another as they continue to heal. Survivors from Columbine and Sandy Hook have attended the healing camps to share their story and help others.

Dragonflies also have the unique ability to hover, move up or down and fly in all directions. This mirrors how Ferncliff prepares those who participate in our programs and ministries for far and wide reaching impact.



Connect



People learn, heal, and grow best while surrounded by a safe, and natural environment. A place that is part of Creation and not apart from it. They participate in authentic conversations to challenge and mold them. As a result, they form communities that will sustain them for years.

Inspire



Ferncliff inspires people to look deep within themselves and find greater meaning. In turn, they leave ready to inspire others to do the same.

Transform



Ferncliff offers experiences (*nature conservation, disaster relief, community support, youth camp, preschool education, and corporate retreats*) that transform lives. Once a person leaves Ferncliff, they move, touch, and impact people's lives with purpose and grace.

Ferncliff welcomes everyone to join this journey of connection, inspiration, and transformation. Guests will leave Ferncliff changed for the better and prepared to change the world—today, tomorrow, and forever.

Far-reaching Impact

In the past few years Ferncliff has seen tremendous growth. Each summer we welcome youth and families for day or overnight camp experience, including meals, lodging, and activities. The demand for the Ferncliff conference center is also increasing. We have to turn away groups because we don't have the space to host all of them.

Ferncliff aims to connect, inspire, and transform the lives of every guest. **But to continue with its far-reaching and life-changing impact Ferncliff needs to improve many of its facilities.** Most of the renovations are due to normal deterioration. Guests have loved and used these buildings and now it is time they get restored.

The estimated expense for all the proposed projects amounts to \$7.6 million.

Each of these proposed improvements will make the experience for the campers and guests better. When they have a better experience we have more opportunity to reach them and participate in their transformation.



The Center for Restoration and Healing



In recent years, the conference center buildings on the east side of Ferncliff Lake were expanded and renovated. Now it is time to upgrade the facilities on the west side of the lake to match the quality of the buildings on the east side.

To enhance the conference and retreat experience, Ferncliff proposes improvements to the Williams Lodge area, the Program Activity Center (old dining hall), and a stream restoration project. In addition to these improvements, Ferncliff would like to build an open air chapel.

Open Air Chapel

Estimated Cost: \$499,000

The open air chapel will become the focal point of the conference center area at Ferncliff. Perched above the stream, this space will invoke a sense of connection to nature and provide a great view of the moving water.

At this time, Ferncliff does not have a chapel or covered worship space in the conference area large enough to accommodate groups of any significant size. This chapel would allow guests to worship outside, hold weddings or use it for other important events. The chapel will be designed to hold 100+ people but also be intimate enough for small gatherings.

The chapel will make Ferncliff ideal for faith based conferences and retreats, weddings and other religious services. We expect every guest to be drawn to this beautiful space where they can engage in worship, prayer, meditation or quiet reflection. A place where they can restore their body, mind, and spirit while delighting in the awe-inspiring natural environment.





Williams Lodge Revisioning

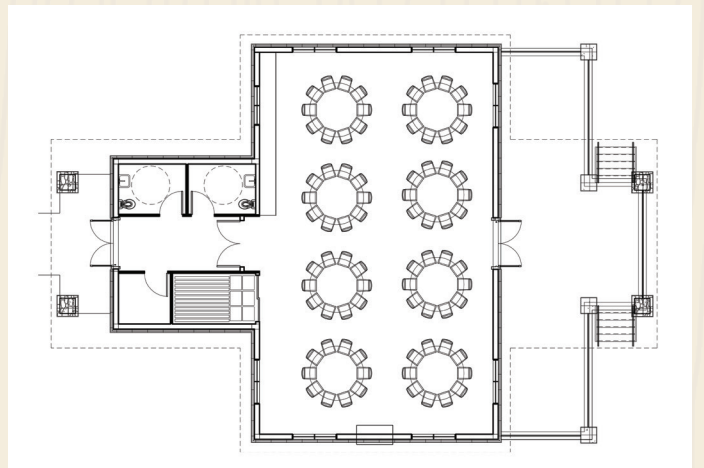
Estimated Cost: \$2,495,000

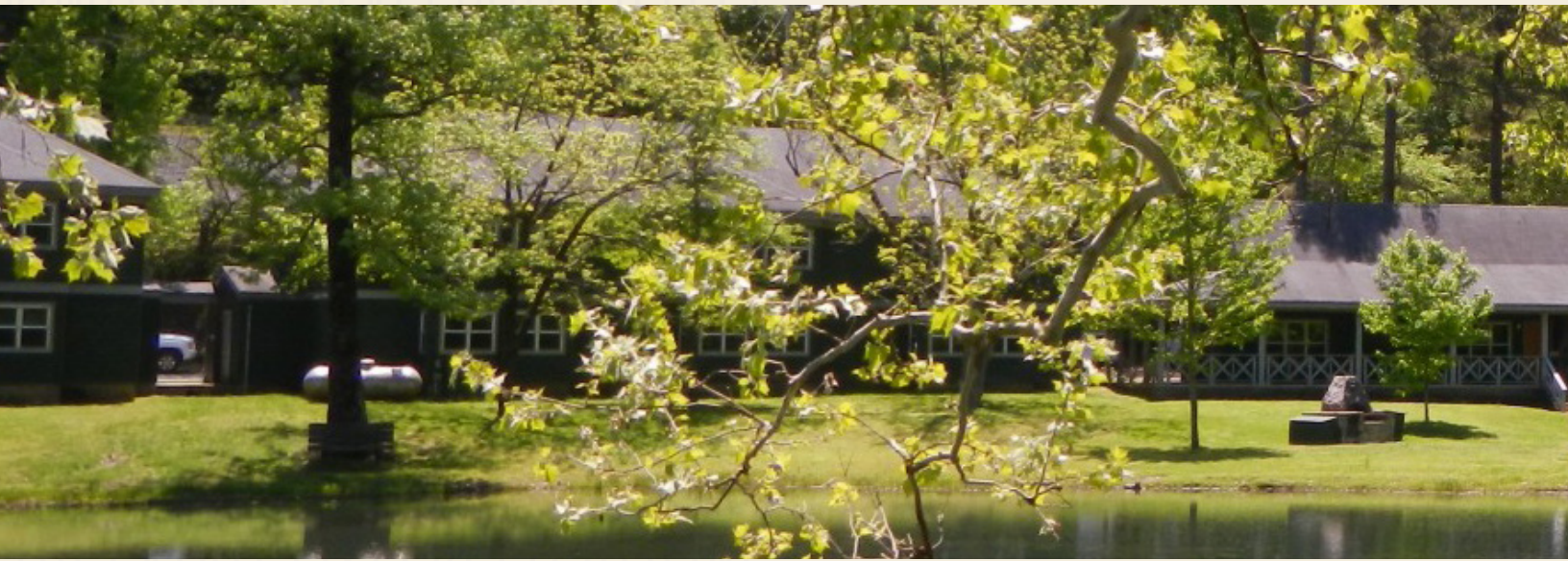
Williams Lodge is one of the oldest buildings at Ferncliff, built over 50 years ago. Because of normal wear and tear, Williams Lodge has persistent issues with water intrusion, plumbing failures, and a sinking foundation. Its current lodging facilities are sub-par. As a result, it is unlikely that Williams Lodge will be able to accommodate conference activity in the future.

A renovation of William's Lodge is not possible because of the high cost and where it is located on the grounds. It is more cost effective to remove Williams Lodge and build a new adult-style lodging and meeting facility.

The new and improved facilities will allow Ferncliff to:

- Host small to medium-sized regional or national conferences that could produce \$300k-\$500k of annual income.
- Add 14 adult lodging rooms that could accommodate up to 5 guests.
- Provide space to thousands of more visitors each year.
- Offer exceptional hospitality to retreat and conference guests.
- Achieve critical missional goals, such as inviting people to learn, grow, and restore oneself.





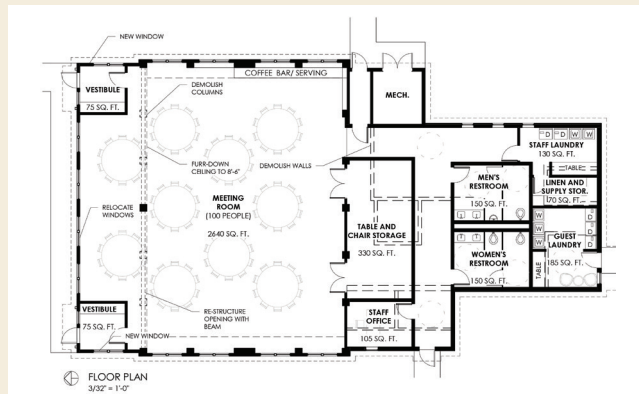
Program Activity Center Renovation

Estimated Cost: \$479,000

This building served as Ferncliff's dining hall for 75 years. Over the last decade it has been useful for many different applications, but has not been ideal. It currently serves as our day camp hub in the summer and several of our faithful guest groups use it multiple times a year. Little has been done to update this building since the early 2000s. The bathrooms are in very poor condition and the now unneeded kitchen area, which includes an ancient vent hood and non-functioning wooden walk-in refrigerator, takes up valuable space.

With a renovation, the PAC would provide:

- A large group meeting area by enclosing the porch, renovating the bathrooms, adding guest and professional laundry facilities, and creating much-needed storage areas.
- Provide \$60-80k a year, paying off the capital investment in 6-9 years.
- A more inviting and hospitable place for guests to have meaningful connections with each other.





Stream Restoration

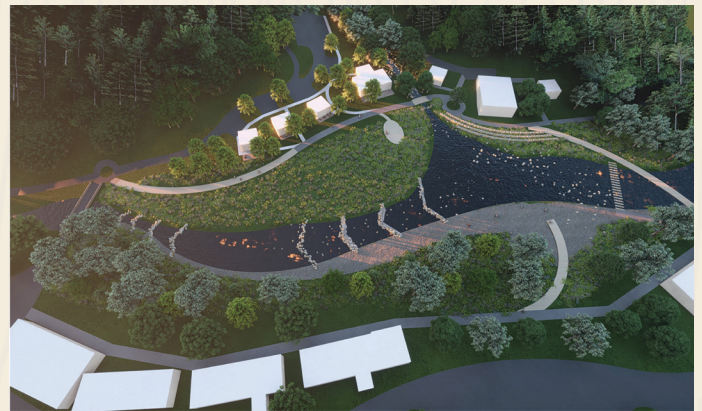
Estimated Cost: \$2,499,000

Ferncliff staff and board members have spent substantial time considering what to do about the lake on the conference center side. While iconic to many guests, it creates problems with upkeep, transportation, and maintenance. It is difficult for campers to interact with the lake because of the marshy and soggy shoreline. This artificial lake does not keep in line with our values as conservationists.

During this process, we reviewed proposals from University of Arkansas landscape architecture students, and looked at a variety of cost and benefit options. In the end, the best way forward is to restore the stream. It fits with the identity and values of Ferncliff, holding ourselves to the highest standards in regards to the protection and care of nature.

The restored stream will:

- Attract more wildlife and provide them natural habitats.
- Offer areas for guests and campers to surround themselves with the awe-inspiring beauty of nature.
- Provide a natural setting for people to unwind in solitude or spark conversations with fellow guests.
- Give people more opportunities to interact with the water, whether it is immersing their feet into the cool water or rock hopping.



Youth Camp Additions



Right now, youth camp facilities are spread out across Ferncliff. This not only causes major program interruptions but it is unsafe as cars travel in the same area that the youth use.

To provide the safest and best experience for everyone, it is important to complete the youth camp. We need to consolidate all the youth appropriate facilities and program spaces to the same location.

The estimated cost to complete the youth camp is \$1.1 million. This includes the Youth Commons and improvements to Belden Pond.

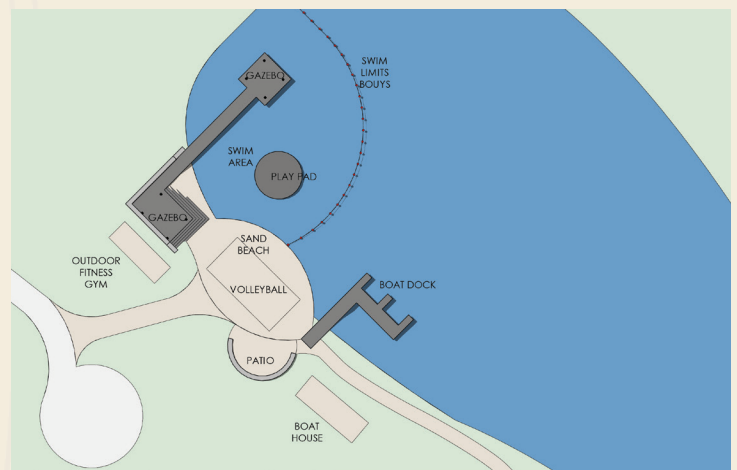
The completion of the youth camp will provide a beautiful, safe, and sustainable environment for young campers to enjoy, make friends, play, laugh, learn, and heal.

Belden Pond

Estimated Cost: \$274,000

One of the highlights of every camper's time at Ferncliff is Belden pond, from swimming, to canoeing, to water games. Belden Pond is well-loved and well-used.

Now it is in need of an upgrade to keep it enjoyable for everyone's use. The pond has significant recreational potential, but first the docks and beachfront need to get developed.





Youth Commons/Youth Dining Hall

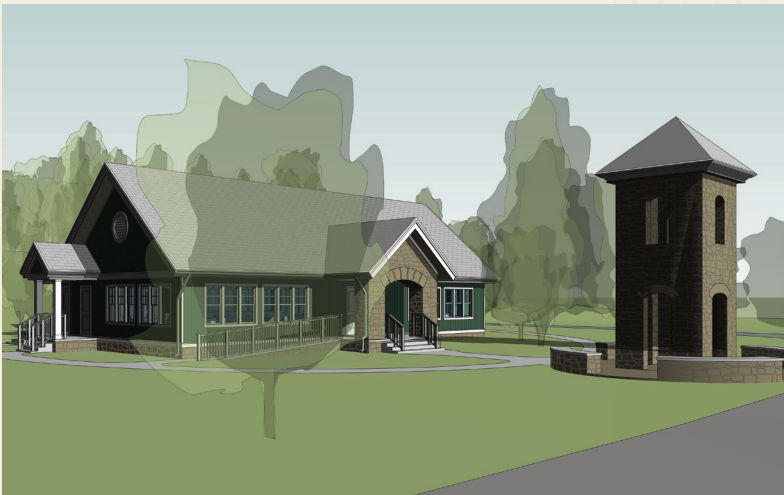
Estimated Cost: \$830,400

Building a multi-purpose space for the youth would solve two issues. First, it would open up three additional months to host adult groups in the summer. Currently, Ferncliff has to turn away many education-related retreats because our youth camp programs occupy the same dining hall.

Second, the youth need a space designed specifically for them. The current dining hall is not ideal for the youth campers and the programs.

A youth dining hall and multipurpose space would offer:

- Adults and youth a place of their own.
- More youth group and adult retreats to happen throughout the year
- A rainy-day indoor space, a gym for recreation, and a break-out place for arts and crafts.
- An alternative dining area.
- A kid-friendly space will provide so many more opportunities personalized to their needs and preferences.



Gateway for Growth

With the completion of these improvements Ferncliff would experience exponential growth. On-campus upgrades will generate new ministry opportunities, enhance existing revenue opportunities, and diversify revenue streams.

The building of “The Center of Restoration and Healing” will now provide space to thousands of more visitors each year. As a result, it will allow Ferncliff to host small to medium-sized regional or national conferences. These could produce \$300k-\$500k of annual income. The investment would pay itself off within seven years.

Renovating the Program Activity Center would benefit several of our guest groups. The CREDO program of the Presbyterian Board of Pensions and the Presbyterian Pilgrimage program come to Ferncliff multiple times a year.

With some investment, this facility could be refreshed into another 85 years of faithful service. This renovated facility could provide \$60k-\$80k a year, paying off the capital investment in six to nine years.

A Youth Commons/Youth Dining Hall would benefit kids and campers and provide more opportunities for youth and adults at Ferncliff. We have to turn away anywhere from 15-20 groups each year because our current facilities can't accommodate everyone interested in coming. This means we miss out on additional revenue. The Youth Commons/Youth Dining Hall would allow us to host 30-40 adult groups, which in turn, would provide significant income to support the ministries and programs at Ferncliff.



Ferncliff not only has a great facility to hold conferences but the environment allows us to enjoy each other better. There's a lot of places where you can have a conference retreat, but not many where you can walk out of the conference room and sit and have a cup of coffee on the porch and take intentional time to unplug. This is a beautiful, relaxing, calm, and very accommodating place to come to.
